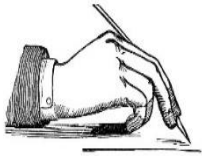

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR VIOLATIONS OFFICER

Howdy friends and neighbors of Spring Lake. Well November is here, and we are at a beautiful time of the year. I hope we can have this kind of weather during Thanksgiving. This puts us in the Christmas Spirit and gets the feeling for some decorations for the annual celebration. For those of you who like decorating for the holidays now is the time to get started. I know we have been looking forward to this time of year and getting into the theme of Christmas. With that in mind, some areas need to be addressed.

November 03 & 17 -----Bulk Waste pick up.

November 10 & 24 -----Yard Waste pick up.

1. When putting yard waste and household waste out on the curb, please keep it in your garage or side yard until a day or two before pickup. I have seen yard waste and household waste out two weeks early. That is very unsightly for our neighbors to look at for that amount of time.
2. Yards are being mowed in a timely fashion, making the villages look that much better, but there are yards that need to be mowed more often. SLPA restrictions state that grass must not exceed ten inches.
3. (Waste Connections – (863-655-0005) Please do not place yard or bulk trash on empty lots.
4. Trailers and boats with trailers are not allowed to be parked in your driveway or yard in villages 2 through 6. They must be put behind an enclosed fence, put in your garage or put in storage. Please check your property restrictions regarding this matter.
5. When you put out any household appliances you must call Waste Connections so they can get additional help to pick it up. (863-655-0005)
6. This is the time of year to share things and be friendly to friends, neighbors, and strangers. We have some neighbors who do not know who lives next door and other neighborhoods who know what each other is doing daily. Let us spread the attitude of being friendly and not negative or hateful all the time. Just a thought.
7. We now have police surveillance here in Spring Lake. We have a problem with speeding and parking on the right of way. Let us see if we can obey the speed limits of 25 and 35 mph on our streets.
8. Do not forget to take down and store the above ground pools before December 1st.
9. Please remember that all work and improvements done on the outside of your residence you must get an approved HOA permit before you get a county permit. Work should not be started until both permits are in hand.
10. Signs posted in your yard must be approved. Check with the HOA office for more detailed information on this issue.
11. A golf cart is a motorized vehicle designed to run 20 mph and for operation on a golf course, sporting, and recreational activities. Four wheelers, ATVs, side by side and other off-road vehicles are not allowed to be operated in the HOA.

New State Law requires to operate a golf cart you must be 15 years old with a learner's permit. 16-year-olds must have a driver's license and 18-year-olds must have a government issued permit.

The question was raised at the last board meeting pertaining to flag poles. Flag poles can be up to twenty feet tall, Flag poles must not impede right of ways or property lines. The US flag can be four ½ feet by six feet. Only two flags can be flown on a pole at the same time. The top flag must be the United States of America Flag and the flag below it can be the State of Florida Flag or an Armed Services Flag.

FYI - No pet pigs, chickens, goats, rabbits, horses, or any other farm/livestock animals are permitted in homes, outside buildings, or running free in the villages of Spring Lake.

I want to thank you for a job well done. We can get even better if we just try to get on a schedule and stick with it. I do not like writing citations any better than you like receiving them. If we all worked together and did our

part, we could be effective and make Spring Lake a better place to live. Feel free to call me anytime with your questions or concerns.

*Growth continues! At the end of 2020 the District had 1,852 utility customers. Including the 52 apartments that will be coming online for both water and sewer in the next several months, as well as current utility reservations, we will have approximately 2,150 utility customers by April of 2024. This does not include any individual home construction utility reservations.

*Be sure to sign up for ACH, the automatic payment plan for utility billing. In the not-too-distant future the District will be going to non-cash payments, so the earlier you sign up for ACH the easier it will be when the transition occurs. A full-page information sheet appeared in last month's issue of The Breeze. Don't delay!!

*The new fishing dock is completed at the Bark Park, and a few more things need to be added to assist our physically impaired residents to access the dock. A picnic table is also being constructed across from the dock.

*Thank you to the PAWSitively Dog Club for hosting an Appreciation Luncheon for District Staff on Friday, December 1st. Monica Griffith is spearheading this 4th Annual Event.

*A Design consulting firm has been hired to develop a 10-year parks and recreation plan for Spring Lake. The first planning meeting will take place later this month. The final concepts and designs should be completed by June 1st and a series of meetings will take place for residents to review the future of our parks and recreation.

*The District Offices will be closed for Thanksgiving on Thursday and Friday, November 23 & 24. As always, emergency services are available if needed.

Would like to remind you that when you move into Spring Lake, please call the Spring Lake Property Office at 655-2230 with your telephone number and your e-mail address. We have our own telephone book for Spring Lake area Property Owners.

There is a “Lending Closet” for the convenience of Spring Lake residents. On hand are walkers, wheelchairs, crutches and other supplies. **The lending closet is in need of shower chairs and stools. Volunteer needed - If you would be interested in volunteering to help with the lending closet, please contact the office.**

REMEMBER...

If you plan to build a structure, including additions, alterations, shed, pool, fence, walls, patio, or paint your house, etc **YOU MUST** submit your plans to the Spring Lake Property Association for approval of a permit, per the deed restrictions for your Village. The permit must be obtained from this office **BEFORE** you apply for a County permit. There is no charge for the SLPA permit.

The SLPA Board of Directors has determined that ALL ROOFING WORK must be permitted by SLPA BEFORE you obtain your county permit – INCLUDING ROOF REPLACEMENT AND/OR WORK RESULTING FROM STORMS.

FENCING

Please note: Fence/boundary issues/disputes are considered a civil matter and should be handled by county officials not the HOA.

According to Highlands County Code acceptable hours to mow are from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm. Please be considerate of your neighbors.

Four wheelers and ATVs are not allowed in Spring Lake. Below is some important information that you need to be aware of.

OFF HIGHWAY AND ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

- **Off-Highway Vehicles are designed to be operated off-road. Ride only on designated trails, off paved roads, and at a safe speed.**
- Off-highway vehicle operators and riders under the age of 16 must wear a USDOT approved safety helmet and eye protection. It is strongly encouraged that riders of all ages wear helmets and eye protection.
- Helmets are the most important piece of protective gear for safe off-highway riding. Always wear a compliant helmet when using an off-highway vehicle.
- Always wear a face shield or goggles to protect yourself from rocks, branches or bugs that can hit your face and cause distractions while driving. Sunglasses are not an appropriate substitute for safety goggles.
- Never drive an off-highway vehicle while impaired.
- Never carry a passenger on a single-rider off-highway vehicle, and no more than one passenger on an OHV specifically designed for two people.
- Ride an OHV that is right for your age; do not ride a machine that is too big for you.
- **Anyone under the age of 16 operating an ATV on public land must be under the supervision of an adult and must have proof of completion of a Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (DACs) safety course.**
- Always check tire pressure before riding; Over-inflated and under-inflated tires can cause difficulty steering.
- Use the buddy system, travel in a group of two or more riders, and never ride alone.
- Always provide someone with a ride plan, including where and when you are riding, and the time you expect to return.
- Remember to tread lightly. Riding behavior that harms the land is self-defeating and irresponsible. Learn to protect and preserve your riding areas.

ATVs, again, **ARE NOT** allowed to operate on Spring Lake community roadways or vacant (privately owned) land.

*Florida law states that all-terrain vehicles (ATV) may only be operated on unpaved roadways where the posted speed limit is less than 35 MPH and only during daylight hours. However, a county may choose to be exempt from this. Or alternatively, a county may, designate certain unpaved roadways where an ATV may be operated during the daytime as long as each such designated roadway has a posted speed limit of less than 35 miles per hour and is appropriately **marked to indicate permissible ATV use.***

Off-Highway and All-Terrain Vehicles are titled, but not registered, and are not required to be insured with PIP and PDL coverage. To title an ATV, submit a completed form [HSMV 82040](#) to a [Motor Vehicle Service Center](#). (Sections 261.20, 316.2074 and 316.2123, Florida Statutes)
