





FYI – It's that time of year again – HOA dues are being collected. Many of you are asking what the dues are for. The primary function of the HOA is to enforce deed restrictions. While much of our funds are used for costs involved in this endeavor (stationery, envelopes, stamps, legal fees etc.) we also offer a free notary service, a monthly newsletter, storage building for the Lending Closet, approval of plans, specifications, & location of new homes, and annual phone directory. We also have a volunteer Board of Directors who, with your input, discuss and make changes for the betterment of our community. We have a reserve fund in case of a natural disaster or we are forced to relocate our business office for any other reason.

A NOTE FROM THE VIOLATIONS OFFICER

Howdy friends and neighbors of Spring Lake. My, how fast did January go! It seems like we just celebrated New Year's Eve. Your New Year's resolution should have been short, if not, the winds we had blew it into late March. I do not know about you but, we have had enough wind and freezing weather this month. Burrrrrrrr. I was told that Saturday and Sunday the 29 and 30 was the coldest days we have had since 1918. We need to stop and be thankful for all the blessings that we have received this past year. Be thankful that we live in a free country and have the things that help make this happen. We, again, have a lot to be thankful for. On the positive side, we are getting some valuable feedback on how we can work together to do a better job in making Spring Lake a better place to live.

1. Please help our community stay neat and clean by putting our garbage containers out and back in storage in a timely fashion. Leaving them out for five or six days after they have been dumped is not the answer. Put out on Thursday and put up on Saturday.
2. When it comes to yard waste, I do understand that Waste connections do not always pick up when they are supposed to. This is when you call Waste Connections and report that your barrels or yard waste has not been picked up. (Waste Connections – (863-655-0005)
3. Parking on empty lots is trespassing unless you have permission. Please do not park on the street side in on empty lots

There are several other things that are noticeable in our neighborhoods.

1. Trailers and boats with trailers are not allowed to be parked in your driveway or yard in villages 2--6. They must be put in your garage or put in storage. Please check your property restrictions, about this matter.
2. We have some illegal dumping in the HOA. This is illegal, have respect for others and dispose of your waste or junk the proper way. We also have noticed residents dumping yard waste and yard clippings on an empty lot next to them. This could be considered littering if you are caught and the lot owner presses charges.
3. Please do not drive in or across empty lots. This is private property and unless you have permission, in writing on file in the SLPA office from the lot owner to drive on the empty lot, it is a violation and trespassing.
4. Please be informed that if you have dogs that bark constantly for a period of ten minutes or longer it is considered a violation of the Highlands County Noise Ordinance. If this happens, please call the County Code office, and report the violation.

Several small issues that need to be addressed.

1. Please be aware of anyone that does work for you, (household repair, house-cleaning, caregivers and lawn and landscape people to name a few). Making sure you know them and trust them. If needed, get a background check on them before something happens or a transaction goes sour.
2. With our new Bark Park up and going please help by keeping your dog on a leash when walking and carry a plastic bag with you to pick up the leftovers. We all need to be Super Duper Pooper Scoopers.
3. Please look at your address numbers on you house and mailbox, some of them need to be replaced, painted or just a face lift. This helps everyone, delivery people, friends, or someone you invited.
4. I want to thank those of you that make my job easy by calling and reporting any violation in your neighborhood. Please feel free to call me and let me know the address of the violation.

I want to thank you for a job well done. We could get even better if we just tried to get on a schedule and stick with it. I do not like writing citations any better than you like receiving them. *Pinedale Estates will be connected to Spring Lake drinking water throughout this month. This project began over 5 years ago, and after securing State Funding 40 residents will be added to the district customer base.


*The Highlands County Recreation and Parks Committee endorsed Pickleball courts in Spring Lake, and at their January 18 Board meeting the County Commissioners voted unanimously to approve the \$180,000 project with a \$90,000 grant. The remaining funds are coming from several other sources not part of the district budget.

*Work will soon begin on renovating water plant #1, and the complete rehabilitation of water plant #2, located at the site of the old power plant. Monies came from the State Revolving Fund.

*The District Board of Supervisors will have a Public Hearing on Utility Rates and Fees, including out of district fees. The Hearing will be held on Wednesday, March 9, 10:00 a.m. at the district office. The regularly scheduled Board meeting will take place immediately following the hearing.

*Don't rely on the NextDoor App or Facebook to get your facts on projects and activities in Spring Lake. The misinformation and outright fabrications are embarrassing for our community, and you need to ignore them. If you want the facts, and the truth, refer to this newsletter, The Breeze, the district web site, and the district email blasts. The District Manager is available to speak with you, or meet, by simply contacting the district office. The claims made on these apps about government conspiracies, low-income housing, taking down comments, payoffs, and hiding information from our residents' border on the edge of scandalous! The District Board and various property associations have NO JURISDICTION on rezoning; that is a County function.

Little Free Library Tidbits

Reopened in September, I hope you are all enjoying our three Libraries again. I am delighted with all the book donations we are getting - and I'm squeezing as many books as possible into each of our 3 LFLs. I am always happy to come get book donations or deliver requested books or you can put books in one of the large black metal boxes at each LFL. When bringing books back, Please DON'T put them in the LFLs because I want to keep my promise to sanitize each book before I offer it again.

Trouble is, it is looking like we are having a problem with someone taking a hundred books or more out of the LFLs in a single day. A few years ago, I caught someone in the act doing that! I suspect she was reselling our best, newest books.

Sometimes I forget to put our label inside each book and I always cringe at 'defacing' our books to make them undesirable for resale. I am writing "NOT FOR SALE" again on as many of our books as possible as a deterrent. These books are for your enjoyment, not for resale. When it becomes obvious that nobody is taking this or that book, I may trade with stewards of other LFLs but the books are never sold.

People ask me what books they should donate. How-to books are very popular, gardening books, craft books, art, decorating, travel books, and gorgeous cookbooks. I even had a book by a carpenter entitled "How to Build Your own coffin." People love biographies, the classics, even old books. We just got a 1953 Emily Post etiquette book. Fun to see how far we have come but that's for another column. However, religious books languish in our LFLs. I suggest you offer them to the many churches in our area. I have a little 'Book Infirmary' for simple repairs- covers separated from books, loose pages so that's not a problem. Put a rubber band around it to alert me and I will fix it.

BEFORE YOU DONATE - look inside the first few pages to see if you have a first edition. It could be worth money. I have found several and returned them to people who were, often, donating books after a loved one has died. One such book was a first edition of one of the most beloved books ever written - 'TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD.' This pristine book with its perfect dust cover was worth \$11,000. I gave it back to the family and they thanked me with a life-size metal statue of a baby elephant which I had hoped to buy from the estate.

'Gorgeous George' is the elephant in my office reminding me daily of our Spring Lake P.O.W. George Sekel, who became an envoy to three presidents after recovering from his 6th escape during WW2. He acquired the elephant traveling the world for decades representing the United States. It's not a political statement (I'm an independent) but a treasured memory of a teenage farm boy who made us proud.

The info below came to me through a Facebook post I believe is very important to share with my neighbors. PLEASE READ AND SHARE, AS THIS COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE OR SOMEONE YOU HOLD TRUE TO YOUR HEART.

If you are ever lost while hiking, get stranded with a broken down vehicle, etc. and you notice your mobile phone is either low on battery or has no signal, here is a tip that very well may save your life:

"Immediately change the voicemail on your phone to a message that gives your approximate location, the time, the date, your situation (lost, out of gas, car broke down, injured, etc.) and any special instructions such as you are staying with the car, you are walking towards a town, etc...The best part of this is, even if your mobile phone dies or stops working, voicemail still works, so anyone calling your phone looking for you will hear the message and know where to find you or where to send help. Pass the message on it may help save a life."

Toxic Sago Palms to dogs - A MUST READ!



SPRING LAKE DOG CLUB MEETING will be held Saturday, February 12th, 400pm at the Bark Park, under the large pavilion. All visitors and members are encouraged to attend this meeting. Discussion will include but not be limited to, Easter Egg Hunt, free winter dog obedience/behavioral classes, shade in the play areas, BBQ, play dates and open forum/discussion. This is the time to have your voices heard about anything pertaining to the club and/or the dog park. You are welcome to bring your fur kid(s) and plan to arrive early to let them run off some steam prior to the meeting. Picnic benches are available for seating or you may bring your own chair to social distance. Hope to see you and your pooch!

FREE Annual Winter Dog Obedience & Behavioral Modification Classes: Will be held for 4 consecutive Saturdays, starting on February 12th after the dog club meeting. The remaining classes will start at 430pm on 2/19, 2/26 and 3/5. Your dog must be current on all vaccines (bring a copy of records or verified ahead of time by instructor speaking w/veterinarian staff) and pre-registered. To preregister, call 863-381-8052. Space will be limited. Classes will be held at the Bark Park.

Sago Palms are very popular in our community of Spring Lake and extremely toxic to our dogs. You will see them in many landscapes and as Bonsai houseplants. If you walk your dog, stay far away and know what their seeds/nuts look like. Please google for pics of Sago Palms and other varieties of toxic palms. Also very popular to our area and highly toxic are caladiums. Lake Placid is the caladium capital of the world, so these varieties abound in our county. If you have some spare time research plants toxic to dogs inside and outside your home. You will be surprised by how many plants you commonly see are so highly toxic. Below is a short article on the Sago Palms to get you started (article taken from the Pet Poison Hotline).

“Sago palms are naturally found in tropical/subtropical environments; they are also used as ornamental Bonsai houseplants. These palms are members of the Order Cycadaceae; genera Cycads, Macrozamia, and Zamias. Examples of the cycad family include Cycad (Cycas cirinalis), Japanese cycad (Cycad revolute), Coontie plant (Zamia pumila), and Cardbord palm (Zamia furfuracea). All parts of sago palm are considered poisonous, with the seeds (nuts) being the most toxic part of the plant. Sago palm contains cycasin, which is the primary active toxic agent resulting in severe liver failure in dogs. Ingestion results in acute gastrointestinal signs (e.g., drooling, inappetance, vomiting, and diarrhea) within 15 minutes to several hours after ingestion. Central nervous system signs (e.g., weakness, ataxia, seizures, tremors, etc.) and severe liver failure can be seen within 2-3 days post-ingestion. Clinical signs include vomiting, diarrhea, lethargy, inappetance, abnormal fluid accumulation in the abdomen, abdominal pain, jaundice, and black-tarry stool. Aggressive decontamination and treatment should be initiated. Even with aggressive treatment, the survival is about 50%.”

If you suspect your dog or cat ate sago palm, call your veterinarian or Pet Poison Helpline immediately for life-saving treatment recommendations.


