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A MESSAGE FROM THE VIOLATIONS OFFICER

Howdy friends and neighbors of Spring Lake. Well July is about in our rear-view mirror. We had some more rain which helped the lawns and flowers. Well, it is hurricane season and we already have had one that was close enough that several tornados approached us but no damage. We had a great Fourth of July. The fireworks were fantastic, but the noise was very unsettling to some of our furry friends and senior aged residents. Comments were made that fireworks were set off for too many days, not just on the Fourth of July. Please watch out for visitors as they do not know what the expectations are in and around Spring Lake. Be a neighbor and be friendly and help them out. Spring Lake activities, such as the parks and picnic areas will be in full swing during August. With these things in mind, we have a few items that need to be addressed. I want to remind our residents that there are restrictions for all residents in each village. These HOA restrictions are provided on the website. (www.springlakeproperty association.com)

With that in mind some areas need to be addressed:

FYI: At the last Board Meeting, the board supported approval of issuing citations for violations any time the violations officer sees one, not just on the Monday's when all villages are inspected. So that means if you bring in a trailer, boat, or put out bulk waste or yard waste early or violate any of the restrictions in your village you will receive a violation letter from the Office. If you have any questions, please contact the SLPA Office or me for more information.

- 1. Please get a permit whenever you remodel, change, or improve your residence on the outside. Call SPLA and get an application for a building permit.
- 2. Please use the Waste Connection Calendar to put your bulk waste and yard waste on the curb for the correct date for pickup.
- 3. We are having a rash of complaints about trucks, trailers and boats parked in yards and lots overnight and on weekends. These are deed restriction violations. If you can see the boat or trailer from a front, side or back street, the restriction has been violated. You must put the trailer in storage, garage or behind a fence. If you need to work on or clean up your boat, trailer, or camper trailer, call the office to get a 3-day pass. Check your deed restrictions.
- 4. One thing I see is people driving too fast in golf carts. I have seen golf carts driving across empty lots (this is a violation, you are trespassing) Please stay on the street. You must be 16 years of age and have a certified driver's license. I can see in the future, that if we continue to take advantage of the use of golf carts, we may lose that privilege of riding around in a GOLF CART.
- 5. Several complaints have been called in about speeding traffic in Spring Lake. I know everyone is in a hurry to get to town and back home. Please be aware that our speed limits here in Spring Lake are 25 and 35 MPH on the boulevard. Be aware that we have a security watch in Spring Lake and your driving is part of that. SLOW DOWN.
- 6. We have had several RVs and motor homes in Spring Lake. You cannot use these for extra bedrooms while parked in Spring Lake, please call the HOA office if you need to load or clean your Mobile or Motor home.
- 7. Landlords who rent out a residence, would you please inform the residents of the deed restrictions. They must adhere to the deed restrictions, and the property owner is ultimately responsible for their violations.
- 8. Several vehicles are setting around Spring Lake in backyards and empty lots. Untagged and inoperable vehicles must be in a garage, behind a solid fence or in storage. These vehicles will be reported to the county code office, and they will take care of this matter.
- 9. Please be aware that vacant lots are private property. It is illegal to trespass or park a vehicle on any vacant lots without the express written permission of the property owner. Please do not drive across the empty lots just to save a block or two.
- 10. According to the County Code you cannot park on the side of the street overnight or on weekends. This is a county violation and will be reported. Please Park in your driveway or in your garage.
- 11. Remember, this is election year and Spring Lake does not allow any political signs in yards. They may be displayed from inside of the house.

I want to thank you for a job well done. We could get even better if we would use some common sense and just get on a schedule and stick with it. I do not like writing citations any better than you like receiving them. If we work together and do our part, we could make a difference and make Spring Lake a better place to live. If we all put fourth some effort and help one another out, be neighborly and friendly, Spring Lake would be a great place to live.

*The Spring Lake Improvement District Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on the Fiscal Year 2025 budget, including assessments, utility rates and fees, and other financial matters. Public comments are welcomed and appreciated. The meeting will take place on Wednesday, August 14, 10:00 a.m. at the District Office.

PLEASE NOTE – If you own rental property in Spring Lake or have an Air BNB – IT IS IMPORTANT FOR YOU TO KNOW & UNDERSTAND, AS THE PROPERTY OWNER, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE TO SEE THAT YOUR TENANTS OBEY THE DEED RESTRICTIONS. Any violations and/or legal actions will be assigned to the property owner. An abbreviated copy of the deed restrictions is available on the SLPA website for you to print out give to your tenant(s). https://springlakepropertyassociation.com. If you wish to use the Arbuckle Creek Park you need to get the gate code for that park from Spring Lake Improvement District (655-1715) NOT Spring Lake Property Association.

REMEMBER...

If you plan to build a structure, including additions, alterations, new roof, shed, pool, fence, walls, patio, or paint your house, etc **YOU MUST** submit your plans to the Spring Lake Property Association for approval of a permit, per the deed restrictions for your Village. The permit must be obtained from this office **BEFORE** you apply for a County permit. There is no charge for the SLPA permit.

PLEASE NOTE

IF YOU HAVE NOT ALREADY DONE SO, PLEASE PUT YOUR ADDRESS ON YOUR HOME AND MAILBOX SO EMERGENCY VEHICLES (and any new mail carrier(s)!) CAN EASILY LOCATE YOU. "Every curbside mailbox must bear the following address information: A box number, if used, inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals at least 1 inch high on the side of the box visible to the carrier's regular approach or on the door if boxes are grouped." This is a Federal US Postal Service regulation.

According to Highlands County Code acceptable hours to mow are from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm. Please be considerate of your neighbors. Also, please don't litter your grass clippings and leaves into the street or median. Again, please be considerate of your neighbors.



Under a bill signed into law by Gov. Ron DeSantis on Thursday, Florida teens now won't be able to drive golf carts without a permit or driver's license.

DeSantis signed HB 949, a bill sponsored by Rep. Cyndi Stevenson, R- St. Johns, that officially bans young drivers from public streets. The law takes effect July 1.

Florida residents older than 18 must carry a state-issued ID while operating one

If you don't abide by the new state law, the penalty is a **noncriminal traffic infraction with a fine of up to \$108**. **Remember – the Sheriff will be patrolling your community....** so slow down and obey the laws!

The list of benefits to spending time with a dog goes on and on, but it all proves one thing—that a month-long celebration of our furry best friends has been a long time coming.

Whether your dog burrows under the blankets with you at night, plays in the sprinkler, or alerts you to a health need, we know they are constantly improving our lives and making them more fun. Not only that, but the companionship and affection we share with them make their lives better, too. Dog lovers know a life without dogs is a life missing something special, and that's a fact worth celebrating.

Highlands County Ordinances Sec. 4.5-6 – Animal waste Any feces deposited by a dog, cat, or pet pig on public property, public walks, recreation areas or the private property of others must be immediately removed by the person who has custody of the animal unless otherwise authorized by the property owner.

According to Florida Statute 403.413, known as the "Florida Litter Law": Any person who dumps litter in an amount not exceeding 15 pounds or 27 cubic feet in volume, is guilty of a non-criminal infraction, which is punishable by a civil penalty of \$100.

"Litter" means any garbage; rubbish; trash; refuse; can; bottle; box; container; paper; tobacco product; tire; appliance; mechanical equipment or part; building or construction material; tool; machinery; wood; motor vehicle or motor vehicle part; vessel; aircraft; farm machinery or equipment;.....

ALL ABOUT AUGUST

August is the time to reap what you've sown, quite literally even, as most summer vegetables are ready to be harvested.

It goes without saying, that August then is a time to celebrate a good harvest and a good summer! It's also a great time of the year in the southern hemisphere, as winter is finally starting to wrap up, and spring begins to knock on the door.

August was once the sixth month of the year. In the original ten-month Roman calendar, the month went by the name of Sextilis, meaning "the sixth month" in Latin. It wasn't until around 700BC that August was rudely shoved back in the order of months when <u>January</u> and <u>February</u> were added to the beginning of the year by King Numa Pompilius.

August has also changed its number of days multiple times. In the ten-month Roman calendar, the months all had either 30 or 31 days, totaling 304 days in the year. Not only did Pompilius add January and February to the calendar, but he also reduced the number of days in August down to 29. It wasn't until Julius Caesar introduced the Julian calendar that it was left with 31 days, and it's stayed the same ever since!

Another year, another change! After so many changes you'd think the month would have had enough, but no – in 8 BC the month was named Augustus, in honor of the Roman emperor Augustus.

August is also a little bit unique, most of the time at least. In a standard year, there is no other month that begins on the same day of the week as August. In a leap year, however, August begins on the same day of the week as February.

In the northern hemisphere, August is considered to be the last month of <u>summer</u>. In the southern hemisphere, it's the opposite of course, so it's the last of the winter months!

Those born in August are brought into this world under one of two star signs. If you were born before <u>August</u> <u>22nd</u>, you're considered to be a Leo. If you're born on the 23rd or later, you're a Virgo. Leos are said to be very proud people who display great leadership. Virgos, on the other hand, are analytical and hardworking people, while still being kind and loyal.

August also has two birth flowers – the vibrant multicolored gladiolus and the deep crimson poppy. The gladiolus flower is said to represent generosity, strength of character, and deep sincerity. The poppy flower couldn't be more different though, as it is a sign of imagination, eternal sleep, and oblivion!

<u>August has three birthstones</u>: sardonyx, spinel, and peridot. One of the lesser-known gems, peridots come in shades from grass-green to a more earthy olive hue. They're quite a unique gem, really, and quite rare as they can only be found from two very different sources – they can be formed deep in the earth and expelled to the surface along with lava, and they can be found in meteorites! It is claimed that peridots have healing powers and can protect the bearer from evil.

The US also has some pretty delicious-sounding observances for the month relating to food! In August the US celebrates National Goat Cheese Month, National Panini Month, Peach Month, and Sandwich Month.

Milk-Bone brand (The J.M. Smucker Company) founded National Dog Month in 2020 to recognize all the ways dogs make our lives better. The Registrar at National Day proclaimed National Dog Month to be observed each year in August.
