





A NOTE FROM THE VIOLATIONS OFFICER

Howdy friends and neighbors of Spring Lake. Can you believe that the month of February is already half over? We enjoyed a great Valentines Dinner and sharing things with friends. The weather in February was good here in the south, but the Midwest and Northeast took a whopping as far as snow and chilly weather are concerned. We always need to keep our mind open and be thankful for the things that we have today. On the positive side, we are getting some valuable feedback on how we can work together to do a better job in making Spring Lake a better place to live.

1. Please help our community stay neat and clean by putting our garbage containers out and back in storage in a timely fashion. Leaving them out for five or six days after they have been dumped is not the answer. Put out on Thursday and put up on Saturday.
2. When it comes to yard waste, I do understand that Waste connections do not always pick up when they are supposed to. This is when you call Waste Connections and report that your barrels or yard waste has not been picked up. (Waste Connections – (863-655-0005)
3. Parking on empty lots is trespassing unless you have permission. Please do not part on the street side in on empty lots.

There are several other things that are noticeable in our neighborhoods.

Trailers and boats with trailers are not allowed to be parked in your driveway or yard in villages 2--6. They must be put behind an enclosed fence, put in your garage or put in storage. Please check your property restrictions, about this matter.

1. We have some illegal dumping in the HOA. This is illegal, have respect for others and dispose of your waste or junk the proper way. We also have noticed residents dumping yard waste and yard clippings on an empty lot next to them.
2. Please do not drive in or across empty lots. This is private property and unless you have permission to drive on the empty lot is a violation.
3. Please be informed that if you have dogs that bark constantly for a period of ten minutes or longer it is considered a violation. If this happens, please call the County Code office, and report the violation.

Several small issues that need to be addressed...

1. Please be aware of anyone that does work for you, (household repair, house-cleaning, caregivers and lawn and landscape people to name a few). Making sure you know them and trust them. If needed, get a background check on them before something happens or a transaction goes sour.
2. With our new Bark Park up and going please help by keeping your dog on a leash when walking and carry a plastic bag with you to pick up the leftovers. We all need to be Super Duper Pooper Scoopers.
3. Please look at your address numbers on you house and mailbox, some of them need to be replaced, painted or just a face lift. This helps everyone, delivery people, friends, or someone you invited.

4. I want to thank those of you that make my job easy by calling and reporting any violation in your neighborhood. Please feel free to call me and let me know the address of the violation.
5. We want to work with you on all matters that pertain to your property. Feel free to call us at any time and let us know what is on your mind and we will try and work with you.

I want to thank you for a job well done. We could get even better if we just tried to get on a schedule and stick with it. I do not like writing citations any better than you like receiving them. If we all worked together and do our part, we could be effective and make Spring Lake a better place to live. Feel free to call me anytime with your questions or concerns. (217-653-2409)

*The District was required to update the software package we use for billing, and this is the first month the new bills have been mailed and made available on the portal if you use ACH or make payments online. The new bill has a section that says pending late fee of \$5 but that is not the case. Please scroll down to the bottom of the bill and you will see the actual amount that you owe, or what you paid via ACH or online payment. There are no late fees until after the due date, which has been a standard policy.

We regret this complication and over the next few billing cycles we hope to have everything in order. This has been a long and tedious transition for our staff, please have patience and feel free to contact the office at 863-655-1715 if there is something you don't understand.

*Last year at this time we could not get anyone to address our lack of fiber optic. We now have been notified that COMCAST, Century Link, and Delcom are all planning to put in fiber optic. Look for a lot of marketing by these companies once they have their systems in place.

*Residents should note that neither the Improvement District nor the SLPA have anything to do with rezoning and replatting. That is a County function, along with any and all building permits. The complaints against the District and SLPA are unfounded and misleading relative to any new construction projects.

Our LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES are my favorite recycling project of all time. They are important to me and a continuing source of pride in so many ways. For one, we are saving trees - less of them needing to be harvested. For another, your generous book donations reduce the number of books that end up in the landfill while making this reading material available to the many people who cannot afford to buy books. I hope it is as much a 'feel good' feeling to you as it is to me. Without you, none of this would be possible. On average, we get about a hundred books donated every week! We are hugely successful with our LFLs. Pat yourself on the back!

We are indebted to our District Manager Joe DeCerbo and what I call his Spring Lake Warriors for helping keep things running smoothly. Busy as they are already with their regular work, they monitor the condition of our 3 LFLs and make repairs when needed. I never have to ask - they just do it. Right now, they are trying to find time to repair our ECO Park LFL - The Bookworm. Along with being loved half to death every day, BOOKWORM takes a beating in the weather and both huge doors need repair and may even have to be replaced! If anyone wants to help AL do it, you might call SLID and offer - 863-655-1715. I am filling it less full right now as I am concerned our books might become damaged by rain. I suspect AI may have to temporarily remove all the several hundred books (more extra work for him) and store them somewhere while he repairs the doors.

In the meantime, I will restock ALL the other two LFLs on a daily basis. As always, please do call me at 863-655-0811 from 8 till 8 and 8 days a week with your book requests and I will bag up 10-12 of them and deliver them to you, leaving them outside your door. This free service continues to be available to you and always will be. It's a tonic for me (as I am still somewhat isolating) to be able to spend a moment or two talking with you. See? This is the feel-good feeling I do for myself.

So - keep donating. Keep reading. Watch for lots and lots more children's books - I suddenly have about 100 or more. Wish they had their own school bus motif LFL. Maybe finally this year. I also have about 75 (many newer) Danielle Steele books along with our usual 1,400 books in my garage! .

If you have a request for a book or author, call and let me know to watch for it. Right now, I have a request from a single guy who was gifted at Christmas with a slow cooker and needs a cookbook - has no idea how to use this gift. Whenever I put out the word for these special requests, please let me come get it - don't put it in the LFL or the black box near it as it might disappear.

A post appeared on social media about a dog that was run over and killed on Spring lake Blvd. Saturday, February 19th. The driver of the vehicle did not stop, and after attempts by residents to save the dog, it died. Just last week an alligator was run over and killed just outside the ECO Park, and several mailboxes have been run over these past several weeks.

PLEASE pay attention to the speed limit so these senseless accidents stop. It is only a matter of time before a person gets hit. All of us need to be on Neighborhood Watch and try to catch the people who cause these accidents and then leave the scene.

The Sheriff has been notified, but we can't expect them to patrol throughout the day. There is personal responsibility connected to all of these accidents.

SLPA 2022 Election for Board of Directors

The goal of the Spring Lake Property Association is to ensure the Deed Restrictions, for Villages I – VI, are followed in accordance to each Village's incorporation paperwork. This year's election for Board of Directors, two-year term, elected 4 new members. This required over 1,600 ballots being printed, folded, stuffed, labeled and mailed. Unfortunately, only 212 ballots were returned by the deadline of Feb. 8, 2022. That represents just over 13% of the residents and lot owners who could have voted. It is easy for people to complain about how things are done here but please remember that the people who serve as Board of Directors and other committee heads are volunteers. There are only two paid staff positions and they also work very hard.
